

Now I am no longer officially associated with Loden Foundation, but Loden Foundation is one organisation that is always dear to me. 

CHILD SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME

Loden Foundation has been supporting disadvantaged school children and deserving youths since 1999 to ensure that cost is never an obstacle to basic education.

Loden Foundation has focal persons, dedicated teachers and other individuals nationwide who help identify the children in need of support or direct the child to Loden. Once we receive the applications for sponsorship, we start the evaluation process based on the living conditions and income level of the family, parent or guardian.

We ensure that all Loden Child Sponsorship beneficiaries are supported from the time the sponsorship has been made effective until their high school education - after which they can apply for the Loden Youth Scholarship for further studies.

EARLY LEARNING CENTRES

Providing children with quality early childhood care and development (ECCD) facilities is critical in equipping the child with the building blocks for a strong foundation for learning, health, and behaviour throughout life.

To ensure equitable access to ECCD facilities in rural areas, Loden built Early Learning Centers (ELC) in Bumthang, Mongar, Samtse, Paro and Zhemgang and currently run three having handed over two to the government.

In 2023, we were able to donate large interactive smart TVs which included educational learning tools, materials and resources. We also handed over laptops to the facilitators so that they can equip themselves with more knowledge on how to educate our children better!

65 children graduated from our ELCs in 2023

Since 2008, more than 800 children have graduated from Loden ELCs.



This comprehensive training equips educators with the knowledge and tools to deliver the UPSHIFT programme effectively.

By fostering critical skills such as social entrepreneurship, problem-solving, and innovative thinking, the UPSHIFT programme empowers students to reach their full potential, shaping their future.





LODEN SEED

The Loden SEED (Student Empowerment through Entrepreneurship Development) is an entrepreneurial education programme for college and school students. We believe that we can plant the seed of innovative thinking and entrepreneurial enthusiasm in the minds of young people by equipping them with essential business knowledge and skills. This early exposure to entrepreneurship ensures that students consider entrepreneurship a viable career option upon graduation.

We are happy to share that SEED has inspired many students and youths through early exposure to entrepreneurship, inspiring them to realise and pursue their dreams at a young age.

In 2023, we trained **50 college students** from the Royal Thimphu College and Norbuling Rigter College.

Dechen Pelden | Black Mountain Organic Green Tea Perfecting Tea, Empowering Women

In the heart of Samcholing village, nestled within Trongsa district, resides Dechen Pelden, a beacon of resilience and expertise in crafting the finest teas. For 15 years, she delved deep into the art of processing green tea, honing her skills through immersive training experiences in South Korea and Thailand. Her vision now transcends from mere production; it's a story of empowering women, fostering their independence and uplifting the livelihoods of her community.





Dhendup Cheten | Fuzzy AutomationFrom Corporate to Entrepreneurship

Dendup Cheten and his team developed an Advanced Metering Infrastructure (AMI) for Bhutan Power Corporation, which allows remote monitoring of power systems to ensure reliable and efficient supply across the country. The startup is now working towards developing an energiser for electric fencing, which will help address human-wildlife conflict and tackle e-waste. The startup's philosophy is commitment to revolutionise business models, aiming to empower users through sustainable adoption of customised solutions.

In Tashi Yangtse, you might come across Tenzin Chojay, a skilled artisan who creates traditional wooden bowls called 'Dapa.' Tenzin is a Tashi Yangtse Institute of Zorig Chusum graduate, where he honed his expertise in the ancient Bhutanese art of woodturning known as Shagzo. He crafts various exquisite functional and decorative products, including bowls and cups, using different types of wood found in Bhutan. Tenzin plans to expand his market to Nepal and China and preserve this tradional handicraft.

KYÖTON MONLAM TSHULTRIM BOOK

This book project, as an inaugural cultural collaboration between Tsadra Foundation in the US and Loden Foundation in Bhutan, made the works of one of Tibet's illustrious monk scholars, Kyotön Monlam Tsultrim, available to wider global audience. Kyotön was the abbot of Narthang monastery at the peak of its history, and his writings contain many interesting works on Buddhist theory and practice.

The original books are stored in Nechu Lhakhang in Drepung monastery in Tibet. They are books in loose leaf (poti) format and written in obscure Ume script, which, in numerous cases, are abbreviated, faded, or poorly inscribed. The Loden cultural team, through support from Tsadra Foundation, reproduced the books in Uchen typeset and modern layout with a detailed introduction by Lopen Karma Phuntsho in English to make the writings easily accessible to readers.

The book was formally launched at the Shechen Monastery in Kathmandu during the Buddha-Nature conference attended by hundreds of monastics including leading scholars from major Tibetan Buddhist traditions.

LODEN DONATES EQUIPMENT

The Culture team of the Loden Foundation presented three complete sets of video cameras to the National Library and Archives of Bhutan. This donation will help record and digitise Bhutan's Oral and Intangible cultures, safeguarding these fading traditions for future generations.

The Loden Foundation and the National Library and Archives of Bhutan under Department of Culture, Ministry of Home Affairs, enjoy a longstanding collaboration and partnership, working together on various cultural initiatives.



SAVING ENDANGERED ARCHIVES

One of the Loden Foundation's missions is safeguarding Bhutan's cultures, including written heritage, intangible traditions, and arts and artefacts. Loden's cultural programme aims to preserve Bhutan's cultural heritage and promote it by providing free access for religious and educational purposes.

With blessings from the Department of Culture, the Ministry of Home Affairs and the Central Monastic Body, the Loden Foundation has been digitising manuscripts in archives across Bhutan. Most monasteries, dzongs, temples, and private homes have books cherished as sacred objects. These books remain in precarious conditions, vulnerable to deterioration and destruction by fire, dampness, rodents, insects and theft.

Digital technology presents us with an easy and effective way to create copies to preserve priceless collections and make them available to a broader audience and users. Funded mainly by the Endangered Archives Programme of the British Library, our culture team has been engaged in digitising the old scriptures in three important archives of Semtokha, Mongar and Tashigang dzongs. The current project shall cover over 20 archives and significantly add to our existing digital collection of 4.55 million pages of digital manuscripts. These digitised copies are deposited in several repositories for safekeeping and made available for educational and religious use.


